

Secure Your Vote Now! Early Voting, Mail-in Ballots, and Election Day Details from Clerk Kevin McGrier



As the local elections approach in Broadview, residents have several options to cast their vote, ensuring everyone has the opportunity to participate in the democratic process. Here's a guide to early voting, mail-in ballots, and voting on Election Day, scheduled for April 1, 2025.

Registering to Vote

To vote in the upcoming local elections, residents must be registered. If you are not yet registered or need to update your registration details, you can contact **Clerk Kevin McGrier** for assistance. Registering is a straightforward process, and Clerk McGrier's office can provide all the necessary information and help facilitate your registration. **(708) 681-3600 X 271.**

Mail-In Ballots

For those who prefer to vote by mail, Broadview offers mail-in ballots. This is a convenient option if you are unable to make it to the polls in person. To receive a mail-in ballot, registered voters must apply through the Village Clerk's office. The Clerk's office hours are Monday – Friday 10am – 2pm. Once your application is processed, your ballot will be sent to you. Remember, it's important to follow all instructions included with your ballot to ensure it is filled out correctly and returned on time. Mail-in ballots must be postmarked by Election Day, April 1, 2025, and received no later than a few days after to be counted.

Early Voting

Early voting provides a great opportunity for those who want to avoid the crowds on Election Day or who may have scheduling conflicts. Early voting in Broadview starts two weeks before Election Day and runs until the day before. March 17, 2025 through March 31, 2025. You can vote early at designated early voting locations. Voting on Election Day

On Election Day, April 1, 2025, polls will be open from 6 AM to 7 PM. Residents can go to their designated polling stations to cast their votes. To find your polling place, click this link:
