## **OPERATIONS SUMMARY**

- During the month of July 2022 Members of the Broadview Police Department responded to 1557 calls as compared to 1530 calls in June.
- IKE 911 Communications Center received 3623 calls for service for Broadview & Maywood compared to 3514 calls for service in June.
- The Detective Bureau assigned 19 new cases. Two cases were cleared with no arrests.

The police department staffed extra officers for the 4th of July weekend. Six citations for fireworks activity were issued. Each citation carries a \$800.00 fine if found liable.

We participated in the Westchester 4th of July parade.

Officer Sara Krygowski completed her 3 month field training program and is now patrolling the village on her own.

July's monthly online training focused on landlord tenant disputes and applicable civil law in Illinois.

Officers attended a teen advisory talk at the Broadview Library.

Interviews were conducted for a new police administrative clerk. A candidate was selected from the panel of interviewees.

Sergeant Florentino attended the senior luncheon at the Broadview Park District where he handed out 60 gift bags.

Sergeant Grzymkowska, Officer Johnson, Officer Krygowski, and Officer Scalise took photographs for a police recruitment poster.





Broadview Police Crisis Worker Rachel Jacobs of PreCare Center was referred and assessed 8 reports for mental health concerns within the Village.
